THE LITURGICAL YEAR

IPC follows the liturgical calendar to mark the seasons of our life together. We are currently in Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is observed between the end of Christmas and the beginning of Lent and again between the end of Easter and the beginning of Advent. Signified by the color green for new growth, it is the season in which we celebrate the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and what it means to be his disciple. The name of this season is derived from the word ordinal, meaning “to count.” We call this season Ordinary Time because we count and name the weeks in number order (i.e., Second, Third, etc.).
